For More Than 10 Years, NMEC has donated \$10,000 for a scholarship, but recently increased its investment to endowed statues. Full-time Itawamba Community College students who major in education have an opportunity to apply for the scholarship, which requires the recipient to maintain a 3.0 GPA and demonstrate potential for success as well as leadership skills and opportunities that will benefit them as a teacher. They must have graduated from NMEC member school districts with a high school GPA of 3.5 or higher.


