Outdoor Play

Anything yoù teach in an indoor classroom can taught outdoors, often in ways that are more vable for children. Cathy James According to a study published by the Natural Start Alliance, the U.S. saw a 66% increase in the number of registered outdoor preschools and kindergartens between 2016-2017.

Currently there are about 585 schools across the U.S. that are nature-based programs!

Suggestions for Outdoor Learning Spaces

Outdoor learning spaces and storage ideas:

- Shed
- Plastic containers
- Shower caddy
- Pencil boxes
- Dish drying rack
- Buckets or pails
- Party platter with sections for sorting
- Measuring cups and plastic beakers
- Bookbags
- Wagons/Containers with wheels





Outdoor Play and Learning





High-Quality Outdoor Learning Experiences :

- Develop reflective and inquisitive thinking along with problem solving skills
- Allow children to identify hazards and risks
- Develop a love, appreciation and respect for nature and all that is living
- Provide positive health benefits
- Build self-awareness, confidence and self-esteem
- Develop collaborative process
- Foster a lifelong love of the outdoors





Health and Safety Precautions

- Be prepared
- If possible, provide individual basins of water or other sensory materials
- Children should wash hands before and after use of materials
- Set up handwashing stations or germ-x stations outside so that children have many opportunities for washing and sanitizing their hands
- Limit the number of children in each area
- Space learning centers so that children are not within close-proximity of each other

- Ink pads and stamps






- 1. Natural materials are free





Outdoor math/fine motor materials:

- Plastic counters (animals, bears, etc....)
- Rocks, leaves, sticks and other natural collections
- Individual white boards or chalk boards
- Writing materials
- Magnetic, plastic or foam numbers or shapes
- Cookie sheets/divider trays for sorting
- Pool noodles slices
- Weight scale/ tape measure/ rope
- Laminated playing cards/shape cards

- Measuring cups and plastic beakers





- Wooden blocks and ramps
- Cardboard tubes
- Small cars and trucks
- Plastic people or animals
- Other items to enhance block play (loose parts materials)




