Session Title: Project Based Learning in the Secondary Classroom: Engaging Students Through

Collaboration

Presenter: Daniel Parrish

PD Overview: This professional development session will guide participants on a journey into project based learning in the secondary classroom. Teachers will engage in small collaborative groups to design an outline for a specific PBL lesson that can be used in the content classroom in which they teach. Teachers will work in pairs or teams of 3 to plan, design, and build the beginnings of a PBL activity that utilizes cross curricular content so that students become active participants in their learning. Ultimately, the outcome of this session is to provide resources, discussion, and collaboration among the participating educators so that they can foster a sense of collaboration in their classrooms while making the educational space engaging for all.

Session Title: Incorporating Simple Coding into Core Subjects

Presenter: Haylee Lipe

PD Overview: In this interactive, hands-on session, teachers will learn how to incorporate the Code and Go Mouse into their own curriculum to reinforce students' computer science skill of basic block coding.

Session Title: Developmentally Appropriate Practice for Early Childhood Teachers

Presenter: Cara Buffington

PD Overview: In this session, teachers will learn new research that underscores the importance of social and cultural contexts of development and elevates the need for active engagement through play, exploration, and inquiry in ways that support the whole child.

Session Title: Using the MS Early Learning Guidelines and Early Learning Standards

Presenter: Cara Buffington

PD Overview: This session offers A review of the guidelines and standards for the implementation of best practices in early childhood classrooms to meet the developmental needs of young students.

Session Title: A Different Approach to Differentiation

Presenter: Ashley Edwards

PD Overview: In this session, teachers will learn how differentiation can be done easily, and well, when considering the appropriate factors. Teachers can use the basis of differentiation for remediation with struggling learners, and it can also be used for enrichment purposes. Enrichment doesn't have to be different from remediation, in fact, it shouldn't be.

Session Title: What does fluency across grade levels mean in elementary mathematics?

Presenter: Dr. Candies Cook

PD Overview: The 2016 Mississippi College-and Career Readiness Standards uses the words fluency and fluently throughout the mathematics standards. These words are frequently misunderstood in their meaning. "To be fluent is to flow: Fluent isn't halting, stumbling, or reversing oneself. A key aspect of fluency in this sense is that it is not something that happens all at once in a single grade but requires attention to student understanding along the way." (MS CCRS, 2016, p.19). During this session, elementary math educators will explore the components of fluency and how it aligns vertically from grades kindergarten through fifth grade. We will thoroughly unpack the fluency standards and engage in activities that educators will be able to implement in their classrooms with students.

Session Title: How technology can make your classroom life easier

Presenter: Jill Knox

PD Overview: In this session, teachers will learn all the tips and tricks that will help to make life easier in the classroom. We will discuss technology through google, apple, and ipad. Participants will need their laptop as well as their iPad.

Session Title: All About Assessment: From Creation to Evaluation

Presenter: Brittany Franks

PD Overview: In this session, participants will investigate classroom assessment with an emphasis on formative assessment. They will explore tech tools for assessment as well as a variety of other assessment techniques and ways of gathering and using data from each. Participants will also consider the role that scoring and feedback play in the assessment cycle.

Session Title: Mastery Connect: The Assessment One-Stop Shop

Presenter: Brittany Franks

PD Overview: In this session, participants will explore the uses and benefits of Mastery Connect in the classroom assessment cycle. The session will focus on formative assessment and will take a close look at creating, administering, and analyzing assessments in the MasteryConnect platform. Participants will also consider the role that scoring and feedback play in the assessment cycle and see how each is put into practice with MasteryConnect assessments.

Session Title: Schoology Exploration **Presenter**: Thomas Herrington

PD Overview: In this session we will explore different apps and functions within Schoology to help it

become a better teaching tool and more than just a test holder and a filing cabinet.

Session Title: Using GoFormative to Drive Instruction

Presenter: Rebecca Mann

PD Overview: Participants in this session will explore formative assessments and how they drive instruction in the secondary classroom. By using the GoFormative platform, participants will learn how to make instructional decisions based on the data collected. Participants will also discuss how data can be used for student groupings, remediation, and enrichment. Participants will leave this session with self-created formative assessments to use in their classrooms.

Session Title: College and Career Exploration for grades 6-12.

Presenter: Dr. Steve Hurdle

PD Overview: This session will introduce platforms and tools all educators can use to help students to think and plan for future education and careers. Any educator who wants to add a CCR component to their instruction would benefit from this PD.

Session Title: Apple Classroom

PD Overview: Teachers will learn how to set up and maintain their apple classroom. Teachers will be taught different ways in which Apple Classroom can be a tool in the classroom for more than observation purposes, ie... Document Sharing, Screen Share, Lock Screen, etc. (Teachers will need their MacBook and iPad)

Session Title:Fun Fridays with Rigor

PD Overview: Fun Friday with Rigor presents strategies and activities that are fun, motivational, and build rigor in student learning. This session will be filled with fun ideas for incorporating academic skills in writing, inquiry, problem solving, collaboration, critical thinking, and reading. What a great way to make learning fun and engaging for all.

Session Title: Fluency in the Elementary Classroom

PD Overview: Fluency is the bridge that connects word recognition to comprehension. In this session, teachers will learn the research behind effective fluency instruction. Beyond research, teachers will learn how to put research into practice by discussing what fluency instruction looks like in the elementary classroom.

Session Title: Improving Tier 1 Instruction in the ELA Classroom - Elementary

PD Overview: How do I get it all in? That's the question heard from reading teachers around the world.. This session is designed to help educators enhance their reading instruction and planning and focus on the components of the ELA classroom that are most important. Participants will learn about evidence-based strategies for teaching comprehension, collecting and giving feedback. Additionally, participants will learn how to structure their instructional day to "get it all in." Participants will leave the session with practical tips and tools to improve their teaching and increase student engagement and achievement in reading. Whether you're a new or experienced teacher, this session will provide valuable insights to help you make a positive impact on your students' literacy development.

Session Title: Using Green Screens in the Classroom

PD Overview: This session offers a quick how to on using green screens in the classroom. We will discuss how to incorporate the use of green screens to help mastery of different standards. For this session we will use an iOS app called Perfect Video (please download the app prior to the session so we can hit the ground running).

Session Title: CPR

PD Overview: This session will cover basic CPR skills such as learning hands-on CPR and how it can be used as an alternate CPR option instead of mouth to mouth. We will also discuss the Heimlich maneuver and how it can be used on infants, children, and adults. This is a basic understanding course and will not provide CPR certification.

PD Overview: Seesaw is an interactive learning management system specifically designed for elementary students. In this session, teachers will see how Seesaw can be utilized in the classroom to enhance instruction and engage students.

Session Title: Keeping Our Schools Safe Begins With Me

PD Overview: The number of recent school shootings has kept school safety at the top of the minds of parents and school employees. As school officials continue to seek ways to keep students and employees safe, many times they focus only on reactive measures. This session will focus on overall school safety and how individual school employees can help prevent incidents and respond properly when needed.

- Improving their confidence in their ability to defend themselves against an attack.

Session Title: Makerspace for All

PD Overview: Promoting creativity and critical thinking skills for all learners by utilizing a makerspace in your classroom.
